- B1 Mud hut village and compound. Tribes build their homes in different shapes. As you can see the are round. There are also many mud huts built as squares or rectangles.
- B2 Mud hut on its own
- B3 Gold mine. A village was moved so that this company could create this mine. The villagers were given brick houses with tin roofs rather than their more fragile mud huts. They were, however, moved to less fertile ground, the land and water has been polluted by the company which has built an air strip across what was the farming land of this village. 
